- A) A symbol of Métis identity. Sometimes referred to as a “ceinture fléchée” and used as a tool by the voyageurs during the fur trade
- B) A uniquely Métis language that was created through a fusion of French and Cree.
- C) A term used to classify the First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people of Canada
- D) A Métis uprising that occurred in 1869/1870 around the modern day Winnipeg area
- E) A violin played in a distinct style
- F) A period of time where animal pelts were high fashion. Many European traders travelled westward to acquire as many pelts as possible
- G) One of the three Aboriginal groups of Canada with a specific Homeland
- H) A term used to describe people who originate from a specific place
- I) A major food source for the Métis and a main ingredient in pemmican
- J) A strong Métis military leader and buffalo hunter
- K) An armed Métis uprising that occurred in modern day Saskatchewan in 1885
- L) A voucher given to many Métis that was intended to be exchanged for land or money but was rarely ever redeemed
- M) A great Métis political leader who led the Métis in the Red River Resistance and the North-West Resistance. He is also known as the Father of Manitoba
- N) The body of water that runs through Winnipeg (which was one of the largest Métis settlements)
- O) A uniquely Métis structure with two wheels and made up of non-metallic materials. Can be pulled by horses or oxen
- P) A place in Saskatchewan where the final battle of the North-West Resistance was fought between the Métis and Government of Canada’s military forces
- Q) An area of land that is stretched across the prairie provinces, parts of B.C., Ontario, N.W.T. and the northern U.S.A., where many distinct Métis communities were established.
- R) A Plains Cree word meaning “the free people” or “their own boss”. It is also the term used to describe the Métis
