MÉTIS EDUCATION FOUNDATION

Established in 1991 by the Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA), the Métis Education Foundation (MEF) was incorporated as a non-profit charitable foundation with the goal of improving education outcomes for Alberta Métis. In 2006, the MNA and the Rupertsland Institute predecessor (the Labour Market Development Unit – LMD) began to capitalize the MEF and started the process of negotiating Métis endowments with post-secondary institutions across Alberta with funds derive from the Federal Indigenous Labour Market Program. Today the Métis Education Foundation holds an endowment portfolio with a market value approaching \$30 million dollars, and supports 20 post-secondary and two MEF internal endowments.

MEF is governed with a four-member Board of Directors that is made up of the Executive Committee of MNA Provincial Council. The Board meets as needed and generally at least once every guarter to consider matters placed before it by RLI such as new or changes to endowment agreements, reports from post-secondary institutions on the endowments, proposed amendments to these agreements where appropriate, and any other business hat may arise.











IN MEMORY OF CECIL BELLROSE

On Saturday, August 26, 2021 the Métis Nation of Alberta lost a dedicated, and long-time servant of the Métis people, as Cecil held public office from 1996 to 2018 as an elected member of the MNA provincial council. During that time, Cecil served initially as Vice-President of MNA Region 4 and then spent the rest of his time as the Region 4 President where he was known to represent his Region in a collegial and forthright manner. Cecil also served many years as a Métis Education Foundation Board member dedicated to improving the educational outcomes for Métis citizens.

Cecil was at the forefront of Métis Harvesting rights in Alberta and worked tirelessly for the Citizens of the Métis Nation as the portfolio holder of Métis Rights for many years. Over time, Cecil also became the patriarch of the Métis Nation Constitution where he took great pride in representing the MNA at the regional, provincial, and national level, and maintained that same level of enthusiasm for his dealings in business and negotiations with industry.

The Métis Nation of Alberta and Métis Education Foundation would like to express their gratitude to Cecil. He leaves behind a legacy of integrity, leadership, kindness, and Metis pride, and was an eager and zealous representative for Métis self-governance.

MÉTIS SCHOLAR Awards

The Métis Scholar Awards program disburses the proceeds of endowment investments from each post-secondary institution and funds individual students through the Métis Scholar Awards. Under this program, students can access support in the years before the final year of their post-secondary studies. Once students reach the final two semesters of studies, they can be eligible for funding through RLI's Métis Training to Employment program. Since inception, the Métis Education Foundation has awarded more than \$7.4M and provided 1,865 Métis Scholar Awards.

This year \$854,700 was awarded to 182 Métis Scholars at our post secondary partners. Because the Métis Scholar Awards program is created in partnership with post-secondary institutions, the endowments and awards are administered directly by each post-secondary institution.
