Harry is a celebrated Métis political leader, having influenced various levels of government advocating for the rights of the Métis Nation. Harry had a key role in leading two monumental victories for Métis recognition. His determination and passionate advocacy led to the legal recognition of Métis as Indigenous people in Canada's *Constitution Act, 1982*. Later, due to his strategic persistence, Harry began the legal battle that led to the *Daniels v. Canada* victory in 2016. This monumental Supreme Court victory for the Métis finally affirmed that the Canadian government has a duty to respond to the needs of the Métis people.

Harry's accomplishments also include his talented appearance in various productions, authorship of several books, a Master's degree from Carleton University, and his contributions to research on Indigenous rights and justice. Harry's contributions have earned him honorary memberships in numerous Indigenous political organizations.
