Sinclair, a founding member of the Native Council of Canada and the Métis National Council, played a crucial role in securing Métis recognition in the Canadian Constitution in 1982.

Described as an unparalleled leader, his advocacy extended globally, engaging with influential figures to advance Treaty and human rights for Indigenous peoples. Sinclair's legacy includes establishing key institutions in Saskatchewan, such as the Gabriel Dumont Institute and the Saskatchewan Native Economic Development Corporation.
